

# Revonne Butler



Revonne "Van" Faye Butler, 60, of Gladstone, Ill., died at 11:35 a.m. Thursday, July 21, 2016, at her home.

Born Sept. 17, 1955, in Owensboro, Ky., she was the daughter of Roy Leon Patterson and Yvonne Nell Hampton Leathers. On June 8, 1980, she married Scott Butler in Burlington.

Mrs. Butler worked for Henderson County Animal Control for 10 years, for adolescent drug treatment for kids with Young House Family Services, for Great River Medical Center in supplies, as a fork lift driver for Exide, as a hairdresser more than 10 years and as a surveillance operator on the riverboat.

She was preceded in death by her father and one sister.
